Dear Officers:

As previously stated, I have spent ten years (2001–2011) trying to develop a "Leadership Team." These "leaders" will occupy the various administrative levels of our church organization: including, secretaries, HYPA officers, deacons, reverends, elders, bishops and chief helpers. That phase is over.

Sunrise Service

Did you know the first sunrise service in America dates back to 1732. Many churches in the American South still hold traditional sunrise services in cemeteries as a sign of recognition that Jesus no longer lay in the tomb on Easter morning. The service starts early in the morning and is timed so that the attendants can see the sun rise when the service is going. Services usually loosely follows the format of the church's normal service and can include music (hymns or praise band), dramatic scenes and the Easter message. After the service, the church may serve a breakfast that the attendees of the service can attend.

Sunrise service in *The Church of the* Living God The Pillar and Ground of the *Truth* is an ongoing tradition as well. Many rise early and unite together in churches or on the beach to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. As we look at the sun rise up over the horizon, we are reminded of Jesus, the Overcomer, and how He is truly the Light of the world. In Him there is no darkness. "Ye men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing up into heaven? This same Jesus, which is taken up from you into heaven, shall so come in a like manner as ye have seen him go into heaven." (Acts 1:10-11)◆

- Works accomplished in the diocese during the 2012–2013 fiscal year.
- The financial report of tithe paid by the each lo cal church in the diocese with names of tithe payers and number of months paid.
- Compiled and analyzed (What's different from last year?) *Elders' Quarterly Report* blanks.
- Ministerial Works blank (@ H.M. Lewis) for each minister in the diocese, including bishop's Dio cese Assembly report.
- 2. Ensure that each band in your diocese is prepared to turn in a completed *Annual Fiscal Year Report* blank
- 3. Complete *Dossiers* for any elevations you plan to submit.
- 4. Complete *General Assembly Financial Report* for your diocese.
- 5. List members from your diocese who have attended one or more of the *General Headquarters Calendar Schedule* committees and workgroups listed.

This memo comes in time for each diocesan to begin preparation for the 2013 General Assembly. Each diocesan will be scheduled for an individual conference with the Chief Overseer and Assistant Chief Overseer during a morning business session at the Headquarters.

Tithing: Net Or Gross? "What Others Have Said About Tithing"

The question is often asked of ministers, "Am I to tithe from my net or gross?" What answer do you give? The bible says in Malachi 3:8–11:

*Will a man rob God? Yet ye have robbed me.
But ye say, Wherein have we robbed thee? In tithes
and offerings. *Ye are cursed with a curse: for ye
have robbed me, even this whole nation. *10 Bring ye
all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may
be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you
the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive
it. *11 And I will rebuke the devourer for your sakes,
and he shall not destroy the fruits of your ground;
neither shall your vine cast her fruit before the
time in the field, saith the Lord of hosts. *12 And all
nations shall call you blessed: for ye shall be a
delightsome land, saith the Lord of hosts."

There are some important take-aways in this scripture. If you are not tithing, you are ROBBING God. You will be cursed if you don't pay your tithe. But, if you do, you will receive bountiful blessings. The enemy will be held at bay for your sake and shall not destroy what you have worked for. You will be blessed and people who see you will call you blessed. Now with all those promises, many people make the decision to tithe from their gross, but according to the book Mother Mary Lena Tate: Collected Letters and Related Manuscripts, (pp. 128-130), it says "pay one-tenth of their entire net income." "What if I'm in debt?", someone may ask. According to this book, "Your tithe is of all debts the most sacred." Our founder put it very eloquently, when she says, "The multiplication table occupies about the same relation to mathematics that tithing does to stewardship." Set the example of stewardship, ministers, and pay your tithe! ♦
